The Pacific sardine is a pelagic fish found in the eastern Pacific from southeast Alaska to Baja California and the Gulf of California and also along Peru and Chile. They form large schools (up to 10 million individuals) and are often associated with anchovy, hake, and mackerel.

Fishing Season:

Pacific sardines are available year-round, but the best time of year to try fresh sardines is between January and September.

Average size and Weight:

They can reach 16 inches, but are usually less than 12 inches. Average weight from 40g -250g.

Pacific sardines sold mostly in frozen whole round form for canning or further processing. This product is also sold In H&G form (gutted and head removed).

Sensory Characteristics:

Sardines are small fish. They are typically blue-green on the back and have white flanks with 1 to 3 series of dark spots along the middle section.
